Obv. 10: (RH) Bold repunching below the 57 with minute second repunching visible. Minor repunching on 1. File marks in denticles below 85. Very minor CW hub doubling visible on the legend, most visible on the letters UNIT.

Rev. P: Die stage A: No die cracks. Die stage B: Die crack from rims at 10:00 and 11:00 through wreath. Die stage C: Cud forms from 10:00 to 11:00 extending into wreath.

The double die feature of this variety was mistakenly plated under S15 in the first edition. The doubled die is hardly noticeable. Any premium due this variety would be for the dramatic repunched date. It is very scarce with very few reported.

Obv. 11: (C) Wide shallow repunching visible under the date. Repunching on 1 visible only on early die states.

Rev. Q: A sloping die defect is visible in the denticles from 1:00 (shallower) to 2:00 (stronger).

This is a very wide repunched date, although the repunching is shallow. This was plated in Breen's Encyclopedia (Breen-1929). It is scarce, but many high grade specimens have been located. The finest are two MS65 examples graded by PCGS.
